Teenagers accused in half of child abuse cases - BBC News

In this article which reports on the findings of a study into child abuse perpetrated by other under 18s, states "Ian Critchley, who leads the National Police Chiefs Council (NPCC) in tackling child abuse, said the new figures demonstrated the need for parents to have "uncomfortable conversations" with their children about the problem."
