The two hour workshops include a performance of the story with student volunteers and an in-depth look at key scenes with a chance for students to re-direct our actors and evaluate the outcome. There may also be a chance to hot seat characters during the 'Jeremy Vile show'.

- Includes a costumed telling of the story using student volunteers to play the roles
- Followed by a focus on key scenes as laid out to the left

- In depth look at Sampson & Gregory in Act I Sc. I
- Hot-seat family members from Act III Sc. V
- Make both good and bad decisions when re-staging Act V Sc.III
