## **Safeguarding Response to Harley's Tragic Death**

We are all so proud with how the students came into school to support each other that week. They dealt with a range of emotions in a mature and dignified way. The school nurses who came in to provide extra support that week told just how fantastic our students had been, and what they described as the level of maturity and ability to articulate their feelings shown by the students they saw, which included a lot of the most affected Year 11 boys. Harley's funeral took place over half term, as I am sure you will have seen on the local news.

On Wednesday 29 March St Giles Trust will be coming into school to run sessions on knife crime with all year groups throughout the day. This is as a safeguarding response to the awful events of that day. We felt that we needed to leave some time and space before these sessions were run. St Giles have been running as a charity for 60 years, working with a quarter of a million children, young people and adults to live safe, and positive lives. They specialise in uniquely employing, developing and professionalising incredibly passionate and dedicated people with first hand experiences of the issues the clients they work with face, and this is what makes the support they provide so effective.

The mission of SOS+ is to prevent children and young people becoming involved in gangs and youth violence by equipping them with tools, knowledge and support delivered by experts with lived experience <a href="https://www.stgilestrust.org.uk/sos/">https://www.stgilestrust.org.uk/sos/</a>

The Team is working collaboratively with Suffolk Police School Liaison Officers and the One Cop Stop programme as well as Jane Stannard RSHE Schools Engagement Coordinator.
