After the success of Activities Afternoons last year, staff at Stour Valley would like to run them next half term. The aim is for the whole school to go 'off timetable' for one afternoon each week and try something different, work together as a team and learn some new skills. These activities will take place within the normal school day with usual transport home.

When will they be?

One afternoon most (but not all) weeks on different days. Initial dates are: Thursday 16 June, Friday 24 June, Tuesday 28 June, Friday 15 July, Monday 18 July and Wednesday 20 July. As so many of the activities are outside, we expect to move some of these dates in the event of wet weather. If this happens, we will let you know.

What are the activities?

Students will take part in 6 different activities over 6 different afternoons. The activities have been selected for each year group and include some sport, team building, relaxation and creative tasks too. More on these to follow.

How will students be grouped?

Students will be in the same groups they have for Technology subjects. Year 10 students will be in groups similar to the Technology groups they had in Year 9. Each group will not contain any more than 20 students.

What will they need?

All students to wear PE kit on the days when they have an Activity

Afternoon. We recommend they bring in a water bottle. Lunch as usual. For outdoor activities sun cream and a sun hat will also be needed.

How long will the activities last?

After lunch (1:35pm) until 3pm. All within the school day with usual transport home.

How much will the activities cost?

No cost to parents and carers.

What happens next?

Students will be given a timetable of their 6 activities after half term. There will also be a short video explaining the activities during form time.

How can I support?

There will be some activities that some students will find easy, others more difficult and some out of their comfort zone. Keeping an open mind and encouraging everyone to try something new will ensure that students get the most out of this opportunity.

Thanks to all the staff who are giving up their time in what is a very busy term to plan, prepare and run these sessions!

Writer in Residence

Over this last half term we have been very lucky to have a 'writer in residence' (Amber Spalding - no relation to Mr Spalding Head of English!) working with a group of our Year 8 students. I asked Amber to explain what she hoped to give and get from this project.

- The idea behind it is to give back to the community. Creative writing
 matters because it uses personal experience to connect us. I want
 to work with the students to get them to take agency over their
 writing.
- Though we are aiming to write group poems/stories, the purpose behind it is to start, or provide a space where they can continue their creative journey.
- The workshops to an extent, have been tailored by the students.
 So we are going to be looking at a folktale/gothic/horror, and we will be writing a group poem based on a series of images/sounds. They were really interested in horror, fantasy, YA fiction, so I wanted to use this to make their writing experiences with me as enjoyable as possible.
- This project is also a way for me, as a writer, to learn. I am looking
 to get involved more in the community and potentially teaching, and
 this is the first step!

There will be one final follow-up session, led by Mr Spalding, where the students will finish their work and have it ready for a short anthology for our school library (with front cover designed by Ruby) and for Amber to use in her research and further workshops.

Is your child eligible for SCC funded school travel? If they are, you will need to opt-in by 31 May 2022 to receive travel for the start of the 2022/2023 school term. Year 11 GCSE Examinations Procedures

- Students attend all lessons and all exams until Friday 10 June.
- From Monday 13 June, students attending morning exams go to the exam as normal and then go home. If they are staying in school for any length of time they need to sign in at Reception and follow their normal timetable, regardless of whether they still have an exam in that subject, or not. The member of staff supervises/revises with students but does not need to do a register. Staff may combine student groups, depending on numbers.
- Students arriving for an afternoon exam attend the exam as normal
 and go home. If they are staying on to the end of the school day for
 transport they need to sign in at Reception, even if they signed in
 after the morning exam as the expectation is that everyone will go
 home straight after the pm exam.
- Students are able to attend for any normal timetabled lessons even if they do not have an exam on that day.

GCSE Examination 2022

Please be advised Written GCSE exams will start from 16 May to 27 June. Students need to be available to sit exams up to 29 June. It is advised not to book holidays/appointments during this time as exams cannot be rescheduled. The GCSE results day is Thursday 25 August 2022. Please view the following link for the timetable:


