- Interventions starting: a variety of 1:1 and small group interventions for our SEN students will be starting over the next week, with a few already underway. These include: Touch Typing, Social Skills, ELSA Sessions, Rapid Reader and Additional Numeracy. Your child and you should be informed if they are invited to an intervention. EHCPs should give you priority places in groups if it is listed as a necessary provision in Section F.
- SEND students on trips: We recently had a round of successful trips to the library and local bookshop in Clare with Year 7. For our new SEN students, this was their first venture out into the community as ambassadors for our school. They loved being able to see what was available in local services, with the library being so much more than books!
